Minutes of the Managing Committee of the Kancheepuram District Mineral Foundation Trust Meeting held on 26.09.2022 at 4.00 P.M under the Chairmanship of the District Collector, Kancheepuram.

The 10th Managing Committee Meeting of the Kancheepuram District Mineral Foundation Trust (DMFT) was held on 26.09.2022 at 05.30 P.M in the Conference Hall at Collectorate, Kancheepuram under the Chairperson of the District Collector, Kancheepuram.

The list of participants in the meeting is appended at Annexure - I. The Scope of PMKKKY cover the activities listed below were discussed with the committee members.

High priority areas - at least 60% of PMKKKY funds to be utilized ١. under these heads:-

(i) Welfare of mine affected People

a. Drinking water supply:-

- Centralized purification systems. i)
- Water treatment plants.
- Permanent/temporary water distribution network including standalone facilities for drinking water.
- iv) Laying of piped water supply system.

b. Environment Preservation and Pollution Control Measures:-

- Effluent treatment plants, i)
- Prevention of pollution of streams, lakes, ponds, ground water. ii) other water sources in the region
- Measure for controlling air and dust pollution caused by mining iii) operations and dumps
- Mine drainage system iv)

- Mine pollution prevention technologies, and measures for working or abandoned mines and other air
- vii) Water & surface pollution control mechanisms required for environment-friendly and sustainable mine development.

C. Health care:-

V)

- i) The focus must be on creation of primary / secondary health care facilities in the affected areas
- ii) The emphasis should not be only on the creation of the health care infrastructure, but also on provision of necessary staffing.
- iii) Equipment and supplies required for making such facilities effective.
- iv) To that extent, the effort should be to supplement and work in convergence with the existing health care infrastructure of the local bodies, state and Central government
- v) The expertise available with the National Institute of Miners' Health may also be drawn upon to design special infrastructure needed to take care of mining related illnesses and diseases.
- vii) Group Insurance Scheme for health care may be implemented for mining affected persons

D. Education:

- i) Construction of school buildings
- ii) Additional class rooms, Laboratories, Libraries, Art and crafts room, Toilet blocks.
- iii) Drinking water provisions Residential Hostels for students/teachers in remote areas
- iv) Sports infrastructure, engagement of teachers/other supporting staff.
- v) E-learning setup, other arrangement of transport facilities (bus/van/cycles/rickshaws/etc.) and nutrition related programs

E. Welfare of Women and Children:-

i) Special programmes for addressing problems of maternal and child health, malnutrition, infectious diseases, etc Can be taken up under the PMKKKY

F. Welfare of aged and disabled people:-

i) Special program for welfare of aged and disabled people

G. Skill development:-

Skill development for livelihood support i)

Income generation and economic activities for local eligible ii) persons

The projects / schemes may include training, development of iii) skill development center, self employment schemes

iv) Support to Self Help Groups and provision of forward and backward linkages for such self-employment economic activities

H. Sanitation

- Collection, transportation & disposal of waste, cleaning of i) public places.
- Provision of proper drainage & Sewage Treatment Plant. ii)
- Provision for disposal of fecal sludge
- Provision of toilets and other related activities. iv)

(ii) Welfare of mine affected area

Physical infrastructure: (a)

- for providing required physical infrastructure viz. road, bridges, (i) railways and waterways projects; maintenance.
- damage repair of the existing physical infrastructure viz. road, (ii) bridges, railways and waterways under the control of the Local Bodies, State and Central Government caused by mining or quarrying activities in the nearby area;
- Not more than forty per cent of the Trust Fund may be utilized for other priority areas under the following heads and such other 11. heads as may be decided by the Government:-
