ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR 2024-2025

I. Act Amendment mandating establishment of DMFT

Government of India have issued notification for establishment of District Mineral Foundations Trust (DMF) vide section 9B of Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Amendment Act, 2015 in each Districts of all over the States of India which came into force from 12th January, 2015.

The objective of DMF Trust a statutory body is to work for the interest and welfare of the people and areas affected, directly and indirectly, by mining related operations in such manner as may be prescribed by the State Government, from time to time.

2. Framing of rules by State Government

The Government vide G.O.(Ms).No.57 Industries (MMD.1) Department dated 19.05.2017 have issued orders notifying the new Rule viz"The Tamil Nadu District Mineral Foundation Rules, 2017" to establish a District Mineral Foundation Trust in each District of the State (with an objective to work for the interest and the benefits of the persons and the areas affected by mining operations) to collect District Mineral Foundation Fund from the lessees of Major and Minor Minerals as per the rates specified in this Rules with effect from 12.01.2015.

The said Rules have been notified in the Tamil Nadu Government Gazette Extraordinary Issue No. 143 dated.19.05.2017 and subsequent amendments has also been made in the said rules vide G.O.(Ms) No.90, Industries (MMD.1) Department dated: 27.07.2017 and the same has also been notified in the Tamil Nadu Government Gazette Extraordinary Issue No.248 dated: 27.07.2017.

Establishment of DMFs in the district, date of registration of the 3. Trust, details of members etc.,

The District Collector, Kancheepuram vide Proceedings Rc.No.615/Q1/2017, dated.20.10.2017 has constituted Kancheepuram District Mineral Foundation Trust and Managing Committee. The details of the Managing Committee and Governing Council Members are tabulated below:-

The objective of the District Mineral Fund is to collect fund from the holders of mining leases or prospecting cum Mining leases or quarry leases at the rate of 30% of royalty or Seigniorage fee to be paid under Tamil Nadu Minor Mineral Concession Rules 1959 in respect of mining leases or quarry leases or quarry leases granted before 12th January 2015 and 10% in respect of mining leases or quarry leases granted on or after 12th January 2015 and utilize the funds for the interest and the benefits of the persons and the areas affected by mining operations. The date of collection for DMF Fund for Major and Minor mineral -17.09.2015 (As per Hon'ble Supreme Court Direction)

Fund Utilization:

As per revised guidelines January'2024 Not less than 70% per cent of the Trust Fund shall be utilized for high priority objects including the following heads:-

I. Welfare of Mine Affected People:

- (a) Drinking water supply
- (b) Environment preservation and pollution control measures
- (c) Health care
- (d) Education
- (e) Welfare of Women and Children
- (f) Welfare of aged and differently abled
- (g) Skill Development and Livelihood generation.
- (h) Sanitation
- (i) Housing

Not more than 30% of the Trust Fund may be utilized for other priority areas under the following heads:-

- (a) Physical infrastructure
- (b) Irrigation
- (c) Energy and Watershed Development
- (d) Any other measures for enhancing environmental quality.

Any amount not exceeding 6% of the annual receipts of the Foundation may be utilized for administrative supervisory and overhead costs or establishment expenses of the Foundation.

1. Consequent to the amendment made by the Ministry of Mines and as ordered by the Government of Tamil Nadu vide G.O.Ms.35 Industries (MMD.1) Department dated 11.03.2022, the Governing Council and Managing Committee was reconstituted with MLAs and MPs by the District Collector, Kancheepuram vide Proceedings Rc.227/Q1/2022 dated 19.07.2022. - 2. The DMF Trust is responsible for:
- a) The implementation of various welfare and developmental projects in mining affected areas of the district.
- b) Minimizing/mitigating the adverse impacts, during and after mining, on the environment, health and socio-economic status of the people in mining areas of the District.
- c) Ensuring long term sustainable livelihood for the affected people in mining areas.
- 3. It undertakes the following activities for this purpose:
- a) Receive, maintain, manage, release and utilize the funds accrued.
- b) Plan, identify, design and undertake suitable welfare and developmental projects, following due procedure.
- c) Monitor and coordinate with various executing agencies at field level for successful implementation of projects taken up under DMFT.
- d) Ensure convergence with ongoing/existing schemes/projects of State and Central Government.
- e) Identify and promote innovative solutions.
- f) Ensure regular and swift redressal of grievances.
- g) Coordinate with different State level and District level agencies and departments to ensure the timely and efficiently implementation of the projects.
- h) Any other work entrusted.
- i) In continuation of the formation of DMFT in Kancheepuram District the District Collector vide 7th Governing Council meeting minutes dated 20.05.2020 has listed 53 villages as directly mine affected villages and 68 villages as indirectly mine affected villages.
- j) In continuation of the formation of DMFT in Kancheepuram District the District Collector vide 11th Governing Council meeting minutes dated 10.05.2023 has listed 58 villages as directly mine affected villages and 75 villages as indirectly mine affected villages.
- k) In continuation of the formation of DMFT in Kancheepuram District the District Collector vide 11th Managing Committee & 12th Governing Council meeting Minutes dated 02.01.2025 has listed 62 villages as directly mine affected villages and 95 villages as indirectly mine affected villages

l) As per the revised guidelines issued under PMKKKY, action will be initiated to re-visit the updated list of mine affected villages.

In order enable smooth functioning of the DMF Trust, as per TNDMFT rules 2017, the District Collector has appointed one Accountant and one Data Entry Operator vide Proceedings Rc.89-2/Q1/2023 dated 29.11.2024.






